

YOUTH EDUCATION

The Herberger Theater provides arts experiences and cultural enrichment for children in our community. With your help, we will continue to reach underserved youth and open their imagination to the magic of live performing arts.



ARIZONA YOUNG ARTISTS' COMPETITION FEBRUARY 17, 2024

The competition showcases the diverse and emerging talent of young Arizona artists, introduces them to the audition process, and provides them with an opportunity to interact with highly-regarded arts professionals. Students, ages 15-21, compete in the areas of Acting, Dance, Classical Voice and Musical Theatre Voice for an opportunity to win a scholarship to help further their education in the arts.



WOLF TRAPJANUARY 30 - FEBRUARY I, 2024

Wolf Trap is a performance residency and arts field trip program for underserved preschool and Head Start children created to enhance the educational advancement of children and to train parents and teachers in the use of performing arts as a teaching tool. At the conclusion of the classroom curriculum, the children attend a field trip at the Herberger Theater, specially created to give them their first introduction to live performance. Activities include a movement class, ballet and participatory music session.



THEATER CAMP JUNE 3-14, 2024

The Herberger Theater and Free Arts for Abused Children partner to heal young lives through the performing arts. Teens living in group homes, shelters and residential facilities throughout Maricopa County create and experience the arts through a two-week camp. Guest artists introduce improvisation, costumes, props and technical components of theater. The final production is totally created by the teens, culminating with an inspirational performance.
