


JANE ANGER

The lovestruck Josie seems to claim him as her own, and Jamie drowns in a wave of self-pity and remorse. When dawn comes, the moon is gone and so is he.

YOUTH EDUCATION

ARIZONA YOUNG ARTISTS' COMPETITION

APRIL II, CENTER STAGE

The competition showcases the diverse and emerging talent of young Arizona artists, introduces them to the audition process, and provides them with an opportunity to interact with highly-regarded arts professionals. Students, ages 15-21, compete in the areas of Acting, Dance, Classical Voice and Musical Theatre Voice for an opportunity to win a scholarship to help further their education in the arts.





ARTS 360: IN-SCHOOL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Arts 360 is an arts education initiative dedicated to integrating the performing arts into early childhood learning. By bringing live performance and arts-based instruction directly into classrooms, the interactive program ensures that all children, regardless of financial means or transportation access, can experience the transformative power of the arts.



CAMP 360

JUNE 1-12, STAGE WEST

Camp 360, a collaboration between the Herberger Theater and Free Arts for Abused Children, gives teens in group homes, shelters, and treatment programs the chance to explore the arts through a two-week camp. Participants engage in theater activities like improv, costumes, props, and tech, culminating in a performance that shares their personal stories through poetry, music, movement, and storytelling.

ART GALLERIES

The Herberger Theater's Art Galleries feature creative and inspiring work, showcasing Arizona artists and providing a platform for visual art. Hours are 12 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Sunday and during performances. All artwork is for sale with a portion of the proceeds from each piece sold benefiting the Herberger Theater's youth outreach programs.

LIGHT IN THE WINDOW

December 1-18, Kax Stage

Lola and her Apo share laughter, stories, and truths across five years in Lola's living room, where holiday scents linger and Parols glow each December. As they craft lanterns, carols in Tagalog and English fill the air. Lola, ever the

storyteller, passes down the Parol's history—woven with faith, resilience, and love. Her light, spirit, and legacy live on through her Apo, who carries them forward, one Parol at a time.



INTERME770

February 2-12, Kax Stage

On the eve of a major recital, a celebrated opera singer encounters her fifteen-year-old self. Together, they reflect on the joys and challenges of pursuing opera as a Black woman, weaving conversation with music. Equal parts

dialogue and concert, the show culminates in a powerful recital of arias—works by Black composers alongside traditional repertoire—creating a moving portrait of resilience, artistry, and the transformative power of song.



LET'S ROCK: FROM SHAKESPEARE TO TUPAC

March 2-12, Kax Stage

Visionary cultural leader Rod Ambrose presents Let's Rock: From Shakespeare to Tupac, a dynamic "Word Music" showcase uniting poetry, jazz, dance, and performance. Featuring Gabriel Bey, Valerie Rochon, Leah Marche, and

Chris "Truth-B-Told" Owens, the evening bridges Shakespeare's eloquence with Tupac's raw power. Through electrifying performances and visuals, universal themes of love, justice, and resilience shine, celebrating language as a force for change and storytelling as a timeless act of activism.





DISCONNECTED RHYTHMS

Disconnected Rhythms is a one-act tap dance production exploring the emotional toll of technology and its effect on relationships. Through three vignettes—a married couple, a family dinner, and coworkers—the show blends rhythm,

movement, and storytelling to reveal technology's isolating yet connective power. Concluding with hope, it reminds us of the beauty and necessity of authentic human connection, offering a resonant reflection on navigating modern life in a digital age.



POST 41

May 18-28, Kax Stage

When Latino veterans came home from World War II, they expected to be welcomed as heroes by the entire community. But after being turned away by other American Legion posts, they decided to build their own post, brick by

brick, in a South Phoenix barrio. Post 41 became a beacon for civil rights activism and a living tribute to the legacy of its members.

The Adventures of Karen and Keith is a modern-retro variety show bursting with energy, dance, and physical comedy. Exploring what happens when two crazy dancers fall in love, it humorously examines gender roles, societal
